Six wards. One accountable constituency agenda.

This prototype positions Gerald Tengekyon as a community-first aspirant focused on practical access to opportunity, inclusive representation, education, and visible follow-through. It does not assign a political party and does not publish unverified personal history.

01

Youth and Women Enterprise

Create ward enterprise desks that connect skills, cooperative support, market information, and transparent pathways to public opportunities.

02

PWD Inclusion

Establish a constituency PWD forum, check the accessibility of funded projects, and provide bursary and enterprise information in accessible formats.

03

Education and Bursaries

Publish bursary criteria, application windows, award timelines, and ward-level summaries, with clear support for vulnerable learners.

04

Grassroots Delivery

Hold a six-ward listening cycle and maintain a public tracker for priorities, responsible offices, progress, and follow-up dates.

WARD COVERAGE

Listen locally. Follow up publicly.

The official IEBC ward names are used below. These focus notes are campaign priorities for discussion, not claims about completed projects.

WARD	PROPOSED LISTENING FOCUS
Lembus	Dairy and crop value chains, water, and farm access roads.
Lembus Kwen	Farm productivity, youth enterprise, and market links.
Ravine	Town services, small business, skills, and responsive offices.
Mumberes/Maji Mazuri	Farm access, forest-edge livelihoods, water, and connections.
Lembus/Perkerra	Water security, farmer organisation, and local infrastructure.
Koibatek	Dairy livelihoods, climate resilience, water, and facilities.

Verified context and required replacements

Research refreshed on 21 August 2026. The IEBC plan states that the general election is planned for Tuesday, 10 August 2027. Party primaries should be completed by 9 May, and candidate nominations are planned from 29 May to 11 June 2027.

Public records list Musa Cherutich Sirma of UDA as the sitting MP. KNBS reports a 2019 census population of 105,273. Gerald's party status remains unconfirmed in this prototype.
